The Nativity shows us that God often works through the unexpected. 
3 Slices of Waffles

A Personal Testimony: Statement of Repentance to My Victims and All Humanity



First and foremost, I apologize to the victims of my crime and to all who similarly suffer pain, emptiness, and mental anguish due to the untimely loss of a loved one caused by another's selfish, sinful, and inhumane act. Indeed, when one unjustly extinguishes a human life, it is as though that person has murdered all humanity. We are, after all, one family, one people, one nation, and of one Creator (1 Corinthians 12:12–26), and therefore subject under one law — to preserve life (Deuteronomy 5:17; Exodus 20:13). When we choose a path of destruction with our own hands, we subject ourselves to the consequences of bad decisions that arise from the evil whisperings of Satan, whose main aim is to destroy all humanity (2 Corinthians 2:11). As 1 Corinthians 15:56 states, "the sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law." We allow our own lowly and darkest desires to lead us away from God's path — the path He firmly established for us to follow (Deuteronomy 28:2).

Inherently, as God's creation (Jeremiah 18:6), we know what is right and what is wrong. When Eve was manipulated by the serpent's deceit in the Garden of Eden, persuaded to believe she would gain divine knowledge by eating the forbidden fruit (Genesis 3:1–3), she could have rejected the lie by simply acknowledging that, being made in the image of the Creator (Genesis 2:27), she already possessed the God-given ability to discern good from evil. Unfortunately, in our weakness and brokenness, we often place God's statutes and commandments last, when they should always be first — following the footsteps of Satan instead of walking with God. I am one such individual — weak, broken, tormented, confused, and ruled by fleshly passions. I have erred in my ways and fallen prey to the "roaring lion" (1 Peter 5:8). I have blamed everyone and everything for my

downfall, except the person truly responsible for my horrid actions: myself. No one inherits the sins of their ancestors (Deuteronomy 24:16; Jeremiah 31:30; Ezekiel 18:18).

I have since repented of my wrongs and sinful ways. As I await my freedom, I have worked hard not only to seek forgiveness from God — to repent and be reconciled — but also to begin making reparations for the harm I caused to my victims, their families, and humanity as a whole. Importantly, I have also learned to forgive myself (1 John 3:19–22). These are essential steps not only in reconciliation, but in developing the moral leadership required to function in society and contribute productively and responsibly.

Without these steps, we cannot truly be part of a community, nor can we actively share the responsibility of preserving life, liberty, and freedom.


Crispina knew that nothing — not threats, hardship, or even death — could separate her from the love of Christ (Romans 8:38–39).
