True freedom begins in the soul. As we journey in faith, we are reminded that spiritual liberty is not found in worldly success or

comfort, but in the grace, mercy, and forgiveness of God. No matter our past, we serve a God who offers healing, renewal, and restoration.

Galatians 3:14 tells us Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law, becoming the Sacrificial Lamb (John 3:16). Through His mercy, our loving Father remembers not our sins (Jeremiah 31:32; Zephaniah 3:15; Hebrews 8:10) and forgives us through His Son (Colossians 2:14; 2 Corinthians 5:17; 1 John 4:10).

The Sacrament of Reconciliation invites us to humbly seek God's mercy and be spiritually renewed (Psalm 50:9). Using the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:3; Deuteronomy 5:7) as a guide, we examine our conscience and prepare for a meaningful confession:

-Turn away from sin (Sirach 5:8; Galatians 5:18)

-Live a holy life (John 5:14)

-Forgive yourself and others (1 John 3:19–21; Matthew 6:14)

-Make amends (Luke 19:1)

-Fast and pray (Jonah 3:15)

-Give alms and do works of mercy (Tobit 4:10; James 2:14)



God, who knows our hearts (1 John 3:19), receives us when we come with peace, humility, and sincerity (1 John 3:20–21). As we keep His

commandments and abide in Him, He abides in us (John 15:4–7). He is Spirit, and we are made in His image (Genesis 1:26). When we let go of the flesh (Galatians 5:16), our spirits are free to commune with Him—embracing true spiritual freedom.

As I await my freedom, I write this testimony about my ability to forgive my family and, above all, myself for my

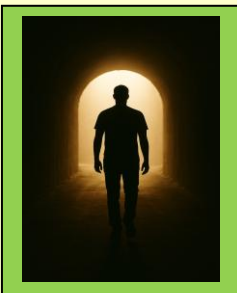

I now look forward to returning home to be with my 93-year-old mother, who is bedridden with health issues, so I can rightfully devote the care that she needs. I am confident that I have received God's salvation and that He has healed me from all my past burdens. I pray every day and give Him all the glory.

Saint of the Month: Saint Dismas, The Good Thief



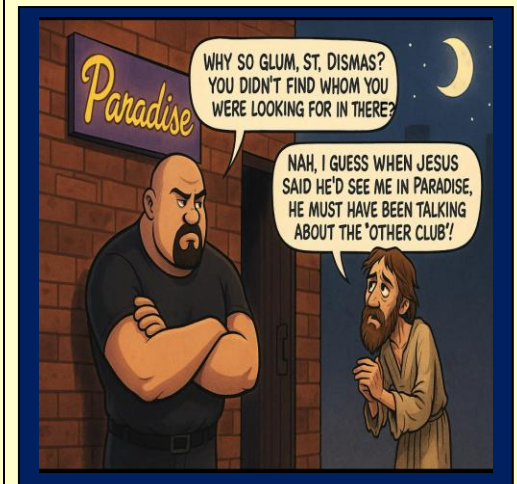
Feast Day: March 25
